Message from the Superintendent

To Our Red Raider Community:

The Mechanicville City School District Board of Education has adopted the 2022-23 budget of \$30,818,448 for your consideration. The proposed budget represents a 2.99% decrease from the current year's budget and carries a tax levy increase of 1.79%, which is below the allowable tax levy. As a result, a simple majority (50% plus one vote) is needed for passage.

We have great things happening in the Mechanicville School District continuing to transform our educational program to fit the needs of our students. The result will be a stimulating learning environment that motivates students and leads to greater levels of engagement. We continue to expand our offerings for a rigorous, challenging curricula aligned to New York State Standards and our teachers and students are up to the challenge of these high expectations. We are proud of the teaching and learning that occurs in our classroom everyday and our many achievements from elementary level up through high school.

On the ballot, you will see a referendum to authorize the use of \$2.3 million from our excess fund balance. These funds would be used to continue the improvement of our facilities such as our campus access roads and our Elementary School band room. Additionally, funds would go towards the purchase of a new bus garage. This would be integrated in the district's capital project, which is in the planning stage for its final implementation.

We are very excited about the future of the Mechanicville City School District and are proud of all the great things going on in our schools. We are confident that the proposed budget will allow us to build upon our successes and continue to move the district forward.

Thank you in advance for considering our budget proposal. Your voice is important.

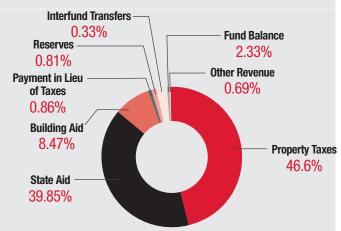

Q. Is the District using their fund balance to expand the scope of the capital project?

A.Yes. Under the referendum for the purchase of the bus garage, the district is requesting to use up to \$2.3 million of excess fund balance for purchase of a new bus garage at 10 Industrial Park Dr. This purchase would be at no additional cost to taxpayers. If approved, the district would reallocate funds to expand the scope of the final phase of the capital project to include several of the items that were part of the original proposal, including but not limited to:

- Creation of new road from ES Access Road to Elizabeth Street Ext.
- Improvements to the Elementary School band room
- · On-site softball field
- · Demolition of old bus garage
- · Milling and paving of district roads and parking areas

Q. What is the tax levy increase for the proposed budget?

A. The proposed budget includes a tax levy increase of 1.79%, or \$252,879, which is below the allowable levy limit of 2.68%.

The annual budget vote for the fiscal year 2022-23 by the qualified voters of the Mechanicville City School district, Saratoga County, New York, will be held at Mechanicville City High school in said district on Tuesday, May 17, 2022 between the hours of 12 noon a 9:00 pm prevailing time at which time the polls will be opened to vote by voting ballot or machine.

Financial Highlights and Program Enhancements

Financial Highlights:

- The district has received an additional \$772,944 in total state aid over the previous year.
- If approved by voters, the district will use \$2.3 million of excess fund balance to purchase a new bus garage facility. If authorized, the district will not issue debt for this project, thereby saving on interest expenses.
- The proposed budget includes appropriations from reserve funds totaling \$250,000 and an additional \$718,439 from excess fund balance as sources of financing.

- 1.0 FTE K-12 Director of Student Support Services
- 1.0 FTE Director of Curriculum, Instruction, and Assessment

- 1.0 Elementary School Behavioral Teacher (on special assignment)
- 1.0 FTE 9-12 Business Teacher
- 1.0 FTE 9-12 Technology/Computer Science Teacher
- 1.0 FTE 7-12 Language Teacher
- 1.0 FTE Wellness, Literacy, Humanities Teacher
- Committee for Special Education Chairperson Stipends (Elementary and Jr./Sr. High School)
